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ORGANIZATIONS PARTNER FOR SECOND ANNUAL CLOTHING DRIVE TO BUILD BEAUTY BETWEEN BALTIMORE AND CUBA

Washington D.C.—It is holiday season and Turn Up for a Cause hosted its Clothes for the Culture charity event on Saturday, December 15, 2018 at Johnny Pistolas Restaurant. Turn Up for a Cause and Alliance Productions collaborated to collect slightly used clothes and natural hair-care products for National Call Dad Inc, and the African Diaspora Alliance's third annual Natural Hair Conference, to help families in Cuba connect with their African roots, and feel beautiful for the holidays despite the circumstances. Donations supported National Call Dad Inc, a non-profit in Hampton, VA that provides counseling, meditation, and various forms of support to children in fatherless homes, and to absentee fathers attempting to reconnect with their families.

"One of our various initiatives is hosting natural hair events in Havana, Cuba to encourage discussion around racial pride through our hair," said Moriah Ray, Co-founder of the African Diaspora Alliance. "The hair products will go directly to Afro-Cuban women and men who have limited access to products catered towards their hair types. Our events provide a safe space for black Americans in Baltimore and Afro-Cubans to discuss black hair politics across borders."

In 2017, the first annual Clothes for the Culture collected 432 pounds of donations, including 37 bags of clothing and over 200 hygiene kits to give to families in Cuba, Puerto Rico, Dominica, and Baltimore. With affected areas in still reaping the impacts of last year's hurricanes, access to many resources including beauty products are even more scarce. This year, Turn Up for a Cause and Alliance Productions collected over 500 pounds of clothing donations, and 150+ natural hair care products to support families in need this winter.

"Giving back to charity and uplifting my community are very important to me," said Naa Adei, co-founder of Turn Up for a Cause, "I'm just happy that I can host an event that supports families in need while celebrating black culture at the same time."
